Friday, January 28, 2022 Big Cypress Recreation Center, 3110 Hendry Drive – Periwinkle Room

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Sue Egloff at 1:30pm.

Present: 41 in person; 3 on zoom; 29 signed in as members.

New Business:

<u>Sue welcomed members and guests</u>. Sue welcomed all first time attendees and explained that we are not a Villages club, but a Chapter of the statewide FNPSociety which has 37 chapters and over 3,000 members state wide.

<u>Linda Neff – Membership Representative</u>. Linda spoke about the benefits of membership and how to join. Our chapter has over 180 members.

<u>Green Isle Gardens Sponsors</u> our plant drawing. They contribute 6 plants, plus there are plants provided by various members.

Florida Native License Plate now available. You can support FNPS by ordering your FNPS license plate. Three thousand pre-orders are required at the DMV before they will begin production. You can pre-order via DMV or <u>www.fnps.org</u>.

<u>Kudos to John Nicholson</u>. Our Villages Chapter FNPS has "adopted" the entryway to Lake Griffin State Park. Since we have not been able to keep a group of volunteers to weeds, mulch etc., Steve Turnipseed connected us to John Nicholson. We have hired him to maintain the entryway for us and he is doing a great job!

Field Trips. Sue Egloff talked about past and future field trips organized by Pam Powell for our Chapter, some of which are available only to members. In November, Chapter members went to Lake Griffin State Park. Pam Powell talked about upcoming trips and how to sign up for them.

Change in General Meeting Day. Sue Egloff and the board have decided to move the monthly meetings from the fourth Friday of the month to the second Friday of the month, same time (1PM) and same place (Big Cypress, Periwinkle room) effective in April 2022. Also there will be no general meetings June-July-August. The future general meeting dates for 2022 are: February 25, March 25, April 8, May 13, September 9, October 14, November 11, December 9. Long Leaf Pine Straw Orders – Jo Hudak is taking orders for bales of long leaf pine straw for \$5/bale, to be delivered sometime between Feb. 7-21. Buyers must pick up their pine straw from the on the day it's delivered from the Big Cypress Rec Center Parking Lot. Jo will call or text buyers and volunteers as soon as delivery date is known. Jo is looking for some volunteers organize the drop off at Big Cypress and to help direct buyers for pick-up. This pine straw is the long-leaf pine straw – it will be freshly raked and baled just 1-2 days before it's delivered, so it will be "clean" and have that beautiful copper color. If anyone wants to order and did not bring their checkbook today, see Jo after the meeting to arrange for purchase and payment.

Presentation: Lake Griffin: What Does it Have to Offer. Jan Wichterman, Park Service, Specialist and Volunteer Coordinator presented information on the history of the park and the recreational opportunities from kayaking-fishing-hiking-camping. She took questions from the audience.
